# A CYCLING TRIP TO- “THE WHITE HOUSE VIEW POINT”

The first stop of the journey was at historic site of ‘Tau Daha’. Taudaha Lake is believed to be a remnant pool of the huge lake that once existed where now the city of Kathmandu sits. According to mythology, a Buddhist mythical monk Manjushree cut the hill in the valley's south, allowing the lake's water to drain off, thereby creating land that was duly occupied by people. Folklore suggests that the "cut" in the hill is the Chobar Gorge, a narrow passage from which the Bagmati River exits the Kathmandu Valley. After the water of the ancient lake drained away, a few small lakes and ponds were created beyond the hills. Taudaha is believed to be one of those ponds. When the lake was drained, countless nagas, mythological creatures that were

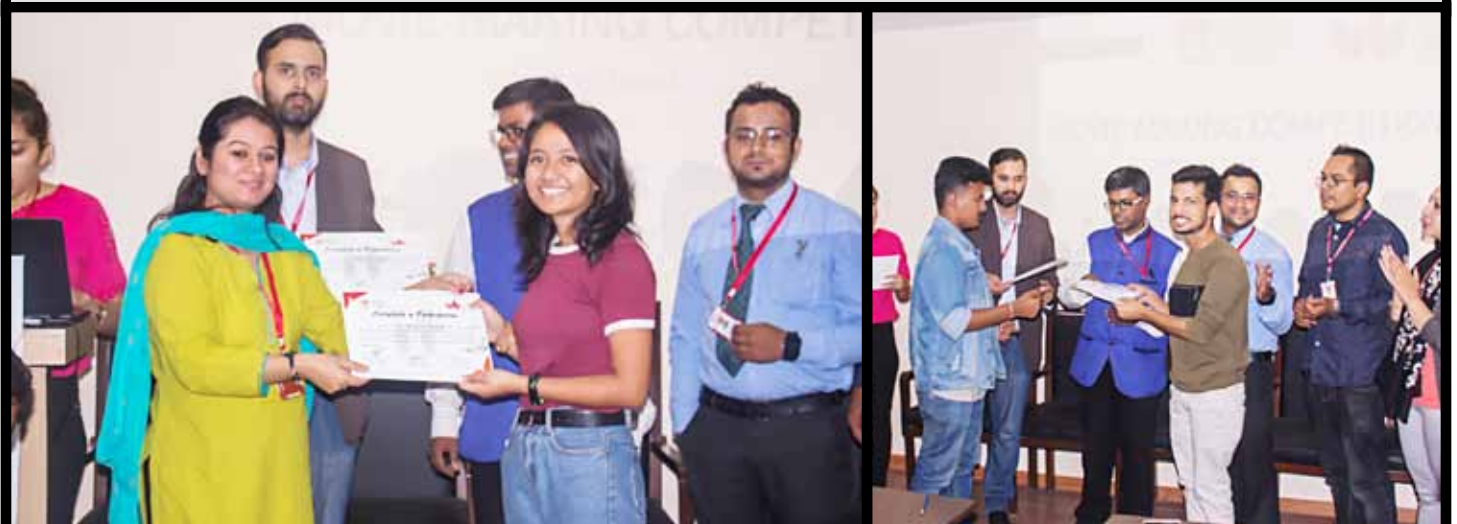

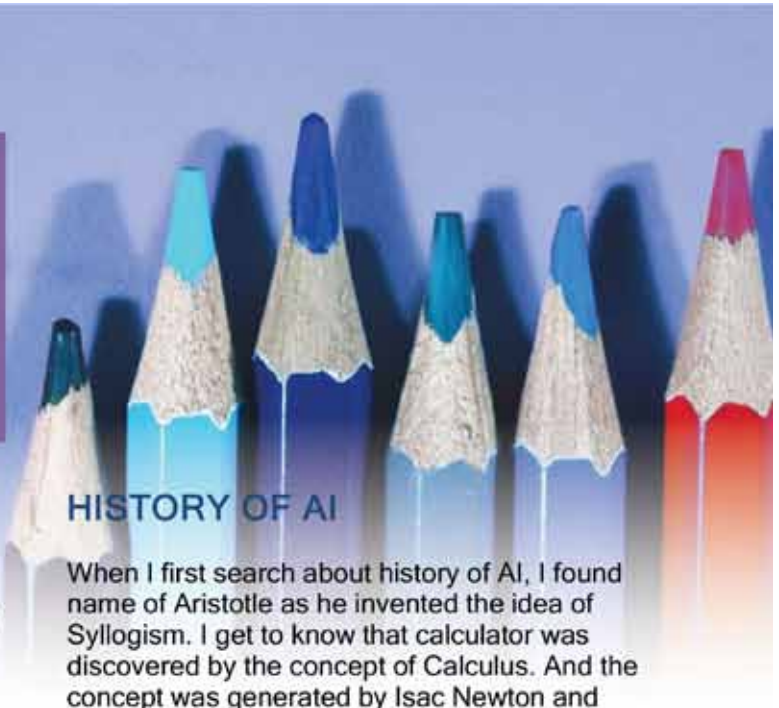

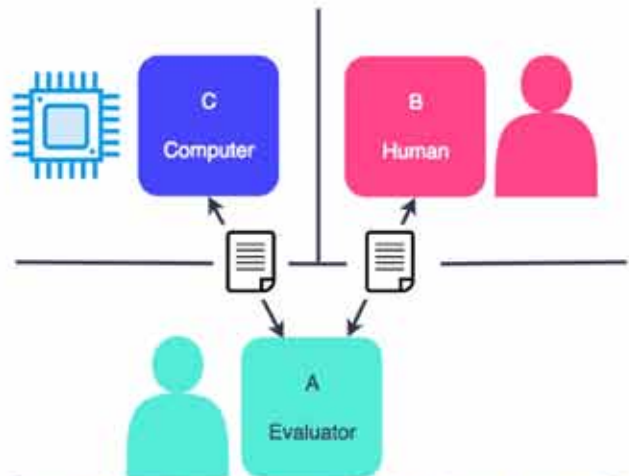

## DIGITAL DIVIDE

**A**ccess to internet is crucial to digital life and hence for increasing the digital footprint in the world. Government and private sectors alike are continuously and vigorously working to build communication infrastructure so that access to internet become far and wide. Whether it's various ISPs or mobile data, internet subscribers and users are increasing in developing countries like Nepal. This obviously is a good news. However, how does Nepal fare at the global level? In terms of affordable, reliable and uniform internet, whether rural and urban areas have access to uninterrupted internet is an important area to discuss in order to understand the digital divide.

In recent times, the gap between rich and poor countries for computer access at the household level is closing. When it comes to affordable smart devices such as phones and tablets, the gap is further reducing. But a 2012 Pew report on Digital Difference shows that 48% of people in households who make less than \$30000 a year still do not use the internet. But this is the case of developed countries where per capita income is

way higher than that of developing country like Nepal. Nepal's projected per capita income for 2017-2018 by the Central Bureau of Statistics, for the first time, crossed the mark of \$1000 at \$1012. At an average a Nepali household in Kathmandu spends \$125 for an internet connection, which is more than 10% of the per capita income – which is larger share of their income compared to countries in the subcontinent. However, this is the scenario of the major cities such as Kathmandu, Pokhara, Biratnagar, Birganj and Nepalganj where major ISPs provide their services. But even in the outskirts of Kathmandu valley where ISPs have not reached, the data internet is quite expensive. Nepal Telecom's 1 GB data for a month costs approximately \$4.8 whereas an Indian customer would get unlimited data at \$2.8 for a month. Therefore, a Nepalese has to spend larger share of his/her income in order to access internet or data which contributes in increasing the digital gap further.

While city residents can enjoy internet connection which is under their budget, they are not guaranteed promised

bandwidth. The maximum speed that ISPs provide is 50Mbps – capable of streaming internet TV. But customers have often complained that they do not get what the service providers have promised. In such a situation they do not enjoy uninterrupted streaming and at the same time they do not get the optimum value for the price they pay for the service. Mobile data users are not even as lucky as customers using cable internet. Although rapidly increasing 4G services, Ncell – a private company only provide it in 21 cities of Nepal. This leaves large part of the country without a broadband connection further increasing the gap among citizens who have access and who can afford internet connection.

Internet and data services are easily accessible and affordable to lucky city residents. These subscribers are likely to enjoy better streaming experience than people who stay away from a certain radius. However, since data packages are expensive, especially for young subscribers, they do not use it for entire day and are always on a look out for a free Wi-Fi connection around. Rest of

the country has to still rely on either 3G or archaic 2G services. This shows that in terms of technologically advanced internet, Nepal uses an archaic, an intermediate and a relatively advanced technology at that same time. But this is the story of the places where there is such a service available. In many rural areas mobile phones are used only for calling and using it for internet is not even an option that is worth a considering for them. Thus, this sort of varied internet experience by the citizens within a distance of few kilometers from each

other certainly increases the digital gap.

While number of subscribers and users is increasing by the day and internet is the most affordable and fastest means of communication, only 11.9% households use internet in Nepal. At the same time when developed world is soon going to adopt 5G technology for an enhanced, affordable and reliable internet for smoother communication increasing their access to better and wider sources for information, Nepal is lagging far behind in terms of availability of the

basic form of the very technology. Its repercussions are reflected in people's social, political, economic lives and access to education and information. But can it not be wide and far reaching? It can be, provided efforts from various sectors, especially government. Many countries such as Norway has recognised internet as the basic and fundamental service that is mandatory by law for the government to provide to its citizens, with right intent and investment, it is possible to bridge the digital divide in Nepal in near future.
